SUBJECT: Position Limits, Accountability Levels and Large Trader Reporting

Requirements in Connection with the Initial Listing of Two (2)

Petroleum Futures Contracts

In connection with the listing of New York Mercantile Exchange, Inc.'s ("NYMEX" or "Exchange") NY RBOB (Argus) Gasoline Futures and NY RBOB (Argus) vs. RBOB Gasoline Futures contracts on trade date Monday, October 24, 2016 (see <u>SER-7749</u> published September 27, 2016), please note below and in <u>Appendix B</u> of NYMEX Submission No. <u>16-392</u>, the corresponding spot month position limits (Rule 559), aggregation allocations (Rule 559.D.), single month and all month accountability levels (Rule 560) and reportable levels (Rule 561) for the new futures contracts.

The spot month position limits for the new financially settled futures contracts shall be in effect at the close of trading 3 business days prior to the last trading day of the contracts. The contracts shall have diminishing balances.
