Pursuant to Regulations 1081.01 increases in regularity for corn, soybeans, and oats will be effective 30 days after a notice has been posted or the day after the application has been approved by the Exchange, whichever is later. The requests to decrease capacity will become effective July 1, 2006.

Pursuant to Regulations 1181.01 and 1291.01 increases in regularity for soybean oil and soybean meal will become effective 30 days after a notice has been posted or the day after the application has been approved by the Exchange, whichever is later. Requests to reduce capacity or daily rates of loading shall become effective July 1, 2006.

Pursuant to Regulation 3704.02 changes in regular capacity will become effective either 30 days after a notice has been posted or the day after the application is approved by the Exchange, whichever is later.
